## Classes slice through boredom

CHILDREN can learn pizza making from a pro in Hampton these school holidays.

Phillippa's Bakery in Brighton are holding pizza-making classes for kids aged six and over.

The mastermind behind the successful bread and bakery business, Phillippa Gordon, said dough was always a favourite with kids of all ages.

"Anything with dough, they love. It's a

progression from playing with playdough," Ms Gordon said.

Participants get to make and take home their own pizza, plus extra dough to play with at home.

"Our philosophy is to make things naturally, and don't interfere with the natural proving process. It's quite good to get kids into that (philosophy) from a young age," Ms Gordon said.

"We use a little yeast

and prove the dough for a long time."

Class numbers are limited to 10, for children aged six and over, so bookings are essential.

Parents are encouraged to drop off and pick up their children from the classes, to run 1:30-3pm on June 30 and July 2, July 7 and July 9 at 608 Hampton St.
